



IMPACT PRAYER – NOVEMBER 2015

“.....In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your *sons* and *daughters* will prophesy, your *young men* will *see visions*, your *old men* will *dream dreams*. Even on my servants, both *men* and *women*, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy..... The promise is for *you* and *your children* and for *all who are far off* - for *all whom the Lord our God will call*.”

Acts 2: 17-18, 39

4. Pray that the apostolic church will look forward to the future with hope, purpose and appropriating the promise of Acts 2:39 in seeing growth and increase as the Holy Spirit works through us.
5. In light of 4 above, let's pray that we will have an outward looking and evangelistic paradigm which draws those afar off as well as those around us as part of our local, national and world mission.
